3RD GRADE SCHOOL SUPPLY LIST 2025-2026

Please label the following supplies with your child's name. Your student is responsible for these supplies. Parents, you may need to replenish some of these supplies throughout the year in case they are used up or misplaced by your student. **PLACE THE SUPPLIES (removed from packaging) listed ON PAGE 1 INSIDE YOUR CHILD'S BOOK BAG AND HAVE YOUR CHILD BRING THEIR BOOK BAG ON THE FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL.**

___ 1 **24 count** box of CRAYOLA colored pencils (label the box with student's name)

___ 1 age appropriate scissors (label with student's name)

___ 1 LARGE washable, disappearing purple glue stick (label with student's name)

___ 1 YELLOW highlighter (label with student's name)

___ 1 **sturdy** pencil sharpener with receptacle for shavings (label with name)

___ 1 sturdy plastic pencil box (**not a big box**). Just big enough to fit the coloring pencils, sharpener, scissors, glue stick, and highlighter listed above. **NO MARKERS OR CRAYONS**. No extras! Keeping things to a minimum makes it easier to stay organized (label with student's name).

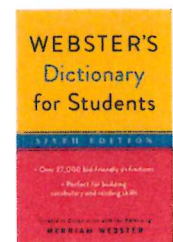
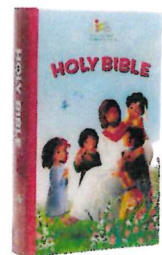
___ 1 soft plastic folder, **BLUE**, with pockets. This is for the 3rd Grade Weekly Newsletter, parent/student updates that are sent home on Tuesdays. *It needs to be plastic to last. Label with your student's name on the front.*

___ 1 soft plastic folder, **RED**, with pockets **AND BRADS**. This is for MATH. *It needs to be plastic to last. Label with your student's name on the front.*

___ 1 soft plastic folder, **GREEN**, with pockets. This is for HOMEWORK. *It needs to be plastic to last. Label with your student's name on the front.*

___ International Children' Bible (Thomas Nelson) - available on Amazon. Simple, straight forward language, ideally suited for children ages 6-10. This Bible is a great choice! **Label with your student's name.**

___ Webster's Dictionary for Students, 6th Edition, Paperback (less than \$5 on Amazon). **Label with your student's name.**



The following items listed on page 2 are also supplies needed for 3rd Grade, but do not need to be labeled. The supplies listed on page 2 are community supplies. Mrs. Ana will manage these supplies that will be used as needed. PLEASE BRING THE SUPPLIES ON THIS PAGE SEPARATELY, IN A BAG, NOT IN YOUR CHILD'S BOOK BAG. YOU MAY BRING IN THE SUPPLIES LISTED ON PAGE 2 WHEN YOU COME FOR ORIENTATION.

- ___ 48 *sharpened* #2 pencils. Ticonderoga brand pencils work best. These *last longer* when sharpening and the leads don't break as easily.
- ___ 1 box (25+) pencil cap erasers
- ___ 8 count chisel-tip, black EXPO dry erase markers (*low odor, please*)
- ___ 1 package (150 sheets) of wide ruled notebook paper
- ___ 1 package of graph paper (for Math class)
- ___ 300 ruled index cards (3 x 5 size)
- ___ 1 bag of individually wrapped candy such as dumdums, jolly ranchers, or fun size M&Ms or Skittles (for Math class)

Parents, you may bring the community supplies listed on page 2 to school when you come for orientation.

Please have your student bring the supplies listed on page 1, with them, in their book bag, labeled and organized as instructed, on the first day of school, not when you come to orientation.

Your student will also need to bring a reusable water bottle to class every day. This will be their responsibility.
